Several pits have been opened and each one has turned out to be simply a pocket of gravel. The largest are 8 by 5 feet. The materials vary from clays and fine sands to coarse gravels and small boulders. They are not well sorted in most pits so that it is not possible to excavate large amounts of any sized material without screening. A pit which was recently5 (1924) opened showed fairly uniform medium gravels. An average sample from this pit showed (Fig. 22): --Figure 23 FAVORABLE QUALITIES Passes 1 to 3 mortar test. Fairly low percentage of soft materials. UNFAVORABLE QUALITIES Low weight. USES Because of smallness of deposit, could be used as maintenance pit for any near-by gravel road. Could...
