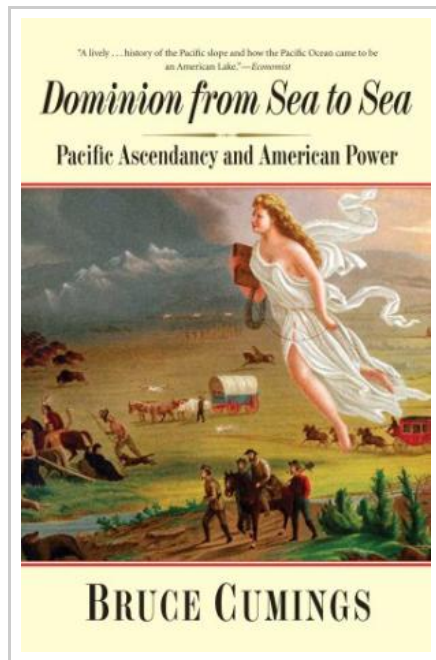




Dominion from Sea to Sea: Pacific Ascendancy and American Power
